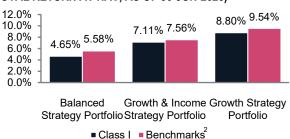
Overview

The Goldman Sachs Asset Allocation Portfolios are managed by the Multi-Asset Solutions (MAS) team.¹ MAS designs customized multi-asset solutions for institutional clients including sovereign wealth funds, pension plans, endowments and foundations as well as managing investment funds. In managing the Portfolios (Goldman Sachs Balanced Strategy Portfolio, Goldman Sachs Growth and Income Strategy Portfolio and Goldman Sachs Growth Strategy Portfolio), MAS takes a fundamental, team-based approach to determining the long-term asset allocations, incorporating dynamic views, and implementing strategies that perform bottom-up security selection. The Team seeks to navigate constantly changing market conditions by incorporating top-down asset class views throughout the market cycle and implement dynamic views seeking to take advantage of market dislocations and changes in the economic cycle.

Q2 2025 Market Review

Q2 2025 was dominated by U.S. trade policy developments and their global economic implications. On April 2nd, 2025, President Trump announced sweeping tariffs which caused a significant shift in risk sentiment and led to aggressive sell-offs in equity markets. During the first week of April, global equities fell by 8.3%, while US equities (SPX) saw a 9.6% decline. The tariff increase announcement was the most substantial since the 1930 Smoot-Hawley Act and increased uncertainty in both business and consumer sentiment. The sharp tightening in financial conditions and supply chain disruptions set the stage for a potential economic slowdown. The situation escalated as the US and China engaged in retaliatory tariffs, eventually imposing over 100% tariffs on each other (which was later dialed back substantially in a May 12th announcement). Markets remained volatile but showed resilience when President Trump announced a 90-day pause on country-specific reciprocal tariffs on April 9th (excluding China), with US equities rallying 9.5% that day. The S&P 500 recorded its best daily gain (+9.52%) since October 2008 and its worst daily decline (~5% drop on April 3rd) since March 2020, all within a span of a week. In contrast to the uncertain trade policy environment, the Trump administration swiftly moved forward on fiscal policy. The "One Big Beautiful Bill Act," which was signed into law on July 4th could potentially boost 2026 growth but has also raised deficit concerns. Despite the quarter's volatility, financial markets performed strongly overall. While global developed market equities rose 11.6% and emerging markets gained 12.0%, performance varied dramatically by region and sector. US large-caps rallied 10.9% as tariff uncertainty subsided, with the technology sector surging 22.9%, significantly outperforming the broader market, while the energy sector declined 8.5% due to lower oil prices. The USD weakened significantly, depreciating by 5.8% against a basket of major currencies, while the 10-year Treasury yield overall remained relatively flat, starting Q2 at 4.24% and ending at 4.22%.

Q2 2025 Performance Review

In Q2 2025, the GS Asset Allocation Portfolios posted positive total returns though somewhat underperformed their strategic benchmarks. US equity positions generally returned positively, driven by the rebound in growth equities, and international and emerging markets equities posted positive returns as well. Within fixed income funds, corporate and emerging markets positions performed positively. Our interest rates options strategy contributed to returns as shorter-term yields fell over the quarter. A small allocation to the GS Managed Futures Strategies Fund returned negatively as trend strategies continued to underperform. Overall, security selection in the underlying funds was negative. The GS Large Cap Growth Insights Fund and GS Emerging Markets Equity Insights Fund underperformed their benchmarks while the GS Large Cap Value Insights Fund GS International Equity Insights Fund outperformed.

Asset Class	Positioning	Rationale
International Developed Markets Equity	Overweight	We remain constructive on international developed equities. Survey indicators are stabilizing (PMI, EC Sentiment) or improving (IFO index) which suggests the economy could hold up in the face of the near term drag exerted by tariff uncertainty. Additionally, the labor market remains strong as firms continue to hoard labor in the Euro Area. We continue to monitor headwinds to growth that could come from tariff impacts.
Emerging Markets Equity	Neutral	Within emerging markets, China continues to be a key consideration. On the external front, the trade related negotiations between US and China have been constructive so far. Export growth remained healthy thanks to the 90-day tariff truce, which allows continued front-loading. A major tariff de-escalation reduced downside risks to growth, but there is unlikely to be a quick solution to a trade deal.
U.S. Equity	Overweight	We remain cautiously constructive on equities at current valuations, which offer attractive medium-term risk-reward. Earnings sentiment witnessed a sharp improvement on tariff relief, boding well for earnings growth. So far core goods inflation remains relatively low and despite impacts from tariffs, the risks are shifting in the direction of somewhat smaller tariff pass through than initially anticipated.
Fixed Income	Neutral	We maintain our neutral to benchmark stance on US government and other allocations to high-quality fixed income that offer additional diversification. We expect gradual decline in longer dated yields as underlying disinflation continues and absolute level of yields remain attractive. However, near-term uncertainty around inflation outlook due to tariffs pass through and recent concerns around high fiscal deficits could keep term premium elevated and longer dated yields range-bound.
Multi-Strategy	Off-Benchmark	The Portfolios allocate to off-benchmark strategies. These include the GS Managed Futures Strategy Fund and various tactical tilts. We continue to believe liquid alternative strategies are important diversifiers, and we continue to seek to take advantage of shorter-term tactical opportunities that arise from market dislocations.

Performance Definitions

Standard Deviation: A statistical measure of volatility indicates the "risk" associated with a return series.

Alpha: the relative outperformance or underperformance of a fund compared to a benchmark index.
