Fund Overview

The Goldman Sachs Managed Futures Strategy Fund seeks to generate long-term absolute return. The Fund applies its proprietary trend-following and tactical strategies across more than 100 markets. By taking both long and short positions in a risk-managed fashion, the Fund aims to profit in both rising and declining markets. Consequently, the Fund may offer potential diversification benefits by producing returns that are uncorrelated to traditional asset classes.

Fund Performance and Market Highlights

The Goldman Sachs Managed Futures Strategy Fund returned -5.57% (I-Share) net of fees in Q4. The Fund's overall long positions in developed market currencies contributed the most, while mixed positions in emerging market equities and short positions in commodities detracted the most.

Global equities gained over Q4. In the US, the S&P 500 grew by 2.07%. Most sectors gained, with Consumer Discretionary, Communication Services, and Financials rallying the most at 14.06%, 8.60%, and 6.67% respectively. Small cap performance rose slightly, with the Russell 2000 gaining 0.01%.

European markets saw slight losses over the quarter. Europe's STOXX 50 returned -2.09%, while UK stocks posted losses as the FTSE 100 returned -0.78%. In Japan, the TOPIX grew by 5.21%. Similarly, Asia ex-Japan equities showed losses in December over tariff concerns. For emerging markets such as China, Donald Trump's anticipated tariffs acted as a headwinds towards investment sentiment. With these concerns, the MSCI EM index drew down by -8.15%.

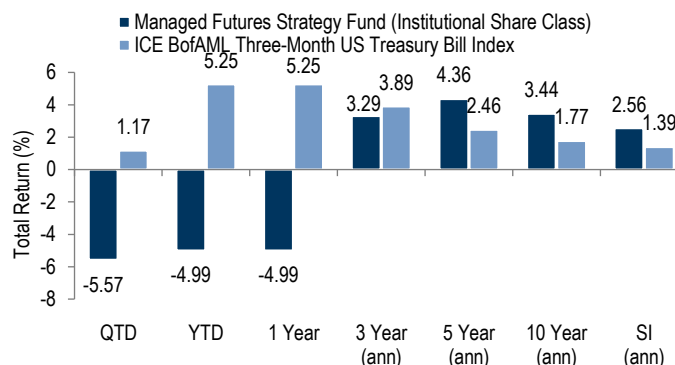
The Fund's positive exposure in developed market equities contributed over the quarter, with short positions in Sweden and United Kingdom detracting. Meanwhile, long positions in short term interest rates detracted the most. Long positions in developed market fixed income also detracted.

Treasury yields fell in most major economies, largely due to rate cuts, selloffs, and volatility. US 2Y gained 60bps, while US 10Y gained by 79bps. Internationally, Germany 2Y and 10Y yields gained by 1bps and 24bps respectively.

The Fund's overall long positions in emerging market fixed income contributed to the portfolio, with long South Africa gaining the most. The Fund's long positions in developed market fixed income also contributed overall, where the long positions in Swiss and Canadian bonds contributing the most. Contributions from long Australian and Swiss bonds partially offset the gains.

In FX, the US Dollar Index gained 7.65% in Q4, appreciating against most major currencies. Meanwhile, commodities gained, led by positive performance from livestock and energy, which were not fully offset by drawdowns from precious and industrial metals.

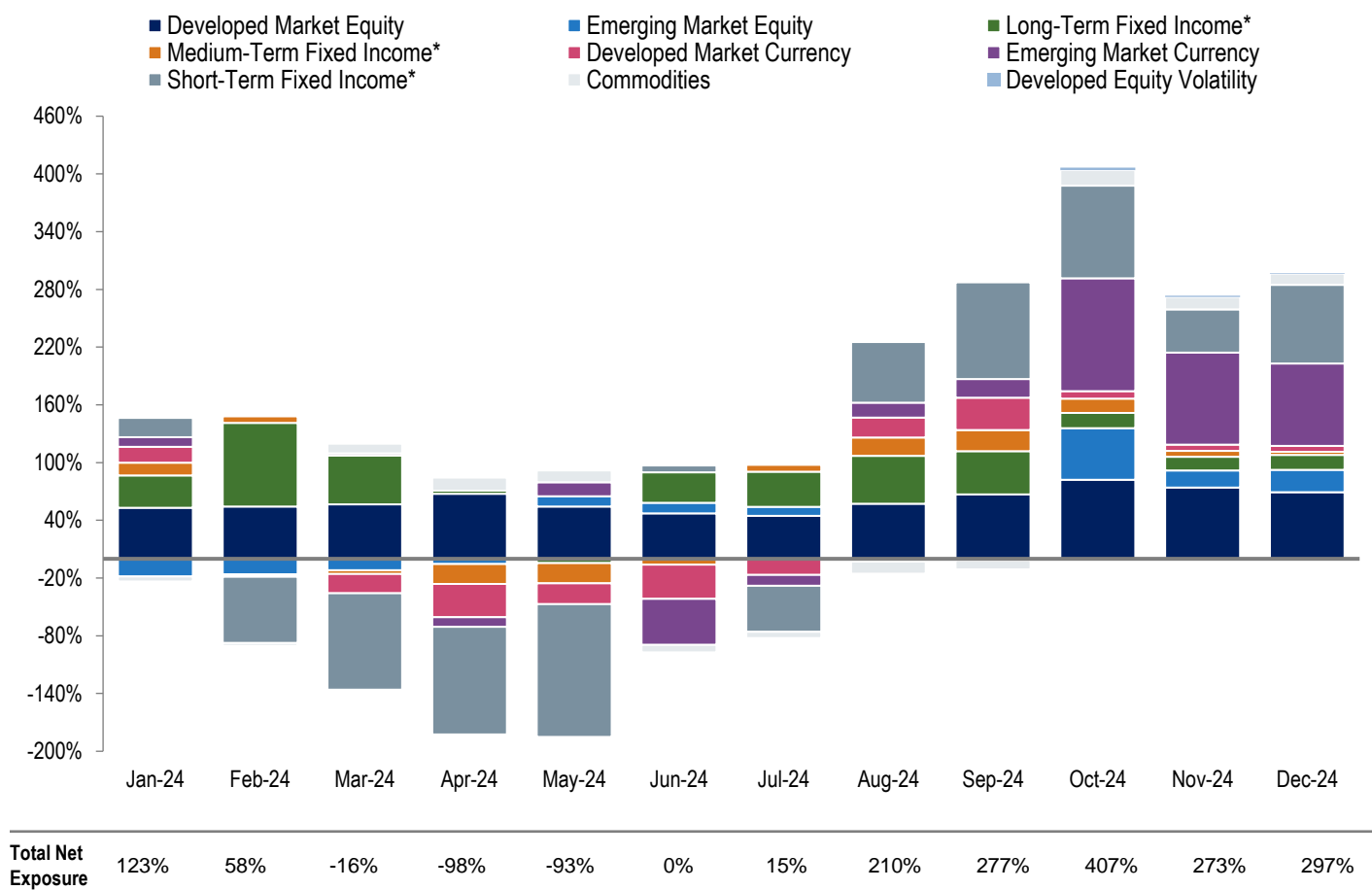

The Goldman Sachs Managed Futures Strategy Fund implements a trend-following strategy that takes long and/or short positions in a wide range of asset classes, including equities, fixed income, commodities and currencies, among others, to seek long-term absolute return. Key Terms

Correlation: A statistical measure of the directional dependence between two variables. Correlation can fall between -1 and 1. A correlation of 1 implies that the two variables will move in the same direction, whereas a correlation of -1 indicates that two variables will move in opposite directions. A correlation of zero implies that the two variables move independently of each other.

Duration-Adjusted: Duration is a measure of sensitivity to a change in interest rates. We duration adjusted the Short-Term Interest Rate contracts to the respective 10-year government bond contract by multiplying the notional exposure of the Short-Term Interest Rate contract by the duration of the Short-Term Interest Rate contract divided by the duration of the 10-year reference contract of each respective country.

Net exposure: The sum of the total value of long and short exposures to that asset class. A strategy that is 30% long the S&P 500 and 25% short the Russell 2000 would have 5% net exposure to the US equity asset class. Net exposure is an indication of the Fund's directional exposure to each asset class. Fund returns are closely related to net exposure. The Net Exposure (%) figures presented in the Asset Class Composition Table on page 2 are the net exposures of the asset class as a percent of the total portfolio, 100%. The **total net exposure** figure is the sum of these asset class net exposures.

Gross exposure: The sum of the absolute value of long and short exposure within each asset class. For example, a strategy 30% long the S&P 500 and 25% short the Russell 2000 would have 55% gross exposure to equity. Gross exposure is an indication of the Fund's total use of capital and leverage.

Total gross exposure: The sum of the gross exposures of each asset class present in a portfolio.

Shorts: Positions in financial instruments in which the investor profits when the financial instrument declines in value.

Longs: Positions in financial instruments in which the investors profits when the financial instrument appreciates in value.

Basis point: 1/100th of a percent.
