



Effective after the close of business on April 30, 2020, the Goldman Sachs Global Income Fund was renamed the Goldman Sachs Global Core Fixed Income Fund and changed its investment objective and principal investment strategy. The Goldman Sachs Global Core Fixed Income Fund invests primarily in a portfolio of fixed income securities of U.S. and foreign issuers. The Fund's investments in fixed income securities are subject to the risks associated with debt securities generally, including credit, liquidity and interest rate risk. Foreign and emerging markets investments may be more volatile and less liquid than investments in U.S. securities and are subject to the risks of currency fluctuations and adverse economic or political developments. Issuers of sovereign debt may be unable or unwilling to repay principal or interest when due.
