



The Goldman Sachs Income Fund invests in a multi-sector portfolio of U.S. and foreign investment grade and non-investment grade fixed income investments including, but not limited to: U.S. government securities, non-U.S. sovereign debt, agency securities, corporate debt securities, agency and non-agency mortgage-backed securities. For this purpose, each Fund relies only on the ratings of the following NRSROs: Standard & Poor's, Moody's and Fitch, Inc. This method may differ from the method independently used by benchmark providers. Goldman Sachs Asset Management will use a single rating if that is the only one available. Securities that are not rated by all three agencies are reflected as such in the breakdown. Unrated securities may be purchased by a Fund if they are determined by the Investment Adviser to be of a credit quality consistent with the Fund's credit rating requirements. Unrated securities do not necessarily indicate low quality, and for such securities the investment adviser will evaluate the credit quality. Goldman Sachs Asset Management converts all ratings to the equivalent S&P major rating category when illustrating credit rating breakdowns. Ratings and fund/benchmark credit quality may change over time.

Treasury includes holdings of government securities issued by the United States Department of Treasury.

Agency Collateralized includes holdings of U.S. government-backed agency (e.g., Ginnie Mae, Freddie Mac, Fannie Mae) mortgage-backed securities and may include to-be-announced (TBA)

mortgage-backed securities.

Non-Rated (NR) includes holdings of securities not rated by any major rating agency. The Fund's since inception performance begins at \$10,000, assumes reinvestment of dividends and does not reflect sales charges.

This number is then annualized. The 30-Day Standardized Subsidized Yield reflects fee waivers and/or expense reimbursements recorded by the Fund during the period. Without waivers and/or reimbursements, yields would be reduced. This yield does not necessarily reflect income actually earned and distributed by the Fund and, therefore, may not be correlated with the dividends or other distributions paid to shareholders. The 30-Day Standardized Unsubsidized Yield does not adjust for any fee waivers and/or expense reimbursements in effect. If the Fund does not incur any fee waivers and/or expense reimbursements during the period, the 30-Day Standard Subsidized Yield and 30-Day Standardized Unsubsidized Yield will be identical.

The monthly dividends include an additional net investment income distribution for all share classes.
